Commissioner Mangau says, "Police Officers will be visible in our communities and on the roads. Officers will deploy to different locations in Honiara City and some parts of Guadalcanal province. Please be reminded that when you behind the wheel do not drink and drive."

Mr. Mangau says, "Driving under the influence of liquor will also put you and the passengers in danger. So be careful when you are behind the wheels."

He says, "Police will keep educating our people and comply with those road safety measures. Police will arrest and deal with those who breach the traffic regulations."
